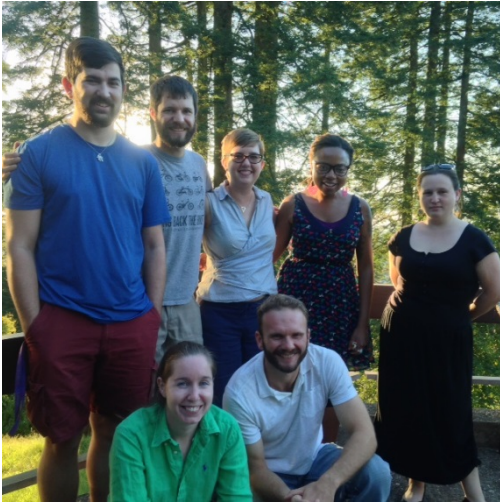


Pray. Give. Encourage.
